What's New for the New Year

For a couple of weeks in December, it seemed that there wasn't much good news to share. With four funerals in a very short time, we were grieving the loss of a charter member, a Ruling Elder, and two senior saints. We were in survival mode! All of us, Elders, Deacons, Staff and you - very, very busy. But God has shown his faithfulness to us. He has demonstrated once again that he holds us in the palm of his hand and is anxious to use our suffering and trials to refine us and prepare us for future joys. And so we persevered on with the plans that God had already laid out before us. And you, our church family, we stuck together and served one another well.

We did not allow the busy-ness of our family matters, or the Christmas season to distract us from other important ministry needs here at Westkirk. Gary Robinson, our Stewardship Elder, prepared a wonderful letter that gave us some more details about the upcoming building expansion. We wished we had more to share at the end of the year, but are pleased that we can begin to move forward on those projects soon. And, we're also pleased to announce that the Session has extended an offer to a candidate for our new Assistant Pastor position. According to our Book of Order, this role is a staff hire and not a 'called,' nor ordained pastoral position. According to that description, and with the approval of the Session, Chuck Heitbrink, Chris Brown, and I crafted a job description and began to wait and see whom God would bring to us that would not only meet the spiritual and professional qualifications, but be an excellent personal fit for our staff. Rather than establish a binding and narrow job description, we looked for a 'general practitioner,' of sorts, who will relish the opportunity to lead and equip members and attendees in a variety of ministry areas, but especially in our youth ministry. The interviews have taken place, background and references checked, and the Session is excited to introduce you to our new, full-time, assistant pastor, Steve Randall.

Since, at this writing, the details have yet to be worked out, I cannot yet tell you when he will begin. But, Steve will work to serve our youth as his primary area of ministry, and in addition to Christian Education, will also work with the Evangelism – Fellowship Commission in the areas of outreach and small groups. You will be hearing more about Steve soon. In the mean while, please take your first opportunity to welcome Steve and his wife, Stefanie, to our Westkirk family!

What's New for Missions?

During the last few months of 2006, we have seen how the Church body has become involved in various ministries in each of the House Kirks or Bible Study groups. Some of you have helped out at Freedom for Youth, in serving food or helping them with the cleaning of their new facility. We also helped in the cleaning of cabinets in their new kitchen. Other groups have participated in the Samaritans Purse project, "Operation Christmas Child," by filling and wrapping shoe boxes for children in distressed countries. Other groups assisted at Hope Ministries by donating clothes and delivering them to their collection center. It was great to see the enthusiasm from those involved as they provided help to each ministry. The Mission Commission is grateful for that response and would like to see it continue in the coming year. There are so many opportunities available for assistance, not just in monetary ways but by our becoming involved physically, personally, which will encourage us all here at Westkirk.

We support foreign ministries such as Romanian Evangelical Medical Mission where in times past some from our congregation have gone over to help by providing medical assistance. Our Young People have gone down to Mexico with Missions Ministry to help build a house for specific church families. Adults are encouraged to do that also. The Youth again are considering whether that is a mission work project they want to be involved with this coming year. I will ask other foreign missionaries and ministries, like the Schmeidels with Campus Crusade, if there are areas where we can help. The Mission Commission representatives for specific Home Ministries receive information as to projects that we can do here in Iowa.

1. **Twin Lakes Christian Camp** has carpentry work, painting, helping in opening the camp for summer, etc. Our representatives are **Rus and Julie Norem**.
2. **Ruth Harbor** has several areas that require assistance—working with girls, mentoring, helping with correspondence etc., annual household duties such as raking of leaves, putting up storms and screens, painting, etc. **Diane Skinner** is the representative for this ministry.
3. **Hope Ministries** has many areas for assistance. The holiday season was wide open for serving food, delivering food to needy families, distributing presents, etc. Our ambassador to Hope is **Julie Norem**.
4. **Freedom for Youth** has just acquired some property with buildings that are being renovated. The need for carpentry, plumbing, electrical as well as assistance with computer training and craft assistance are available. See **Sherie Whitehead** for opportunities for this ministry to homeless youth.

I could keep on going, but the key thought for this New Year is "How can Westkirk help"?? The Missions Commission again thanks you for your support and if you have any questions, please ask any one of the Commission members: Rus & Julie Norem, Ryan Glanzer, Marv & Fran Nugteren, Wendy Reed, Jerry & Diane Skinner, Alvin & Lois Lundgren Stecker, Larry & Sherie Whitehead, and George & Gail De Graaf.

Presenting . . .

William R. Raisch

John and I were warmly welcomed into Bill's lovely and spacious condominium at The Reserve, where he presently lives since returning from Arizona in February 2006. The Charter members of Westkirk need no introduction to Bill, but we may be able to tell them some interesting things about his life while introducing him to the many new people among us.

Bill is a native Iowan, having been born on a farm in Franklin County, near Geneva, and raised with three brothers and two sisters. After graduating from Geneva High School in 1941, he joined the U.S. Navy and was sent to Great Lakes Naval Training Center for basic instruction. Bill actively served in WWII for five years. He was assigned to a submarine chaser along with sixty other men and at age nineteen he supervised the engine room crew, which was an important responsibility for a young man. The last two years of active duty Bill was a V-12 student at Iowa State College (now Iowa State University). This program was offered to persons slated for Navy commissions. After being separated from active duty he joined the Naval Reserves where he served for another five years. Following the war, he attended Iowa State Teachers College (now UNI), graduating in 1947 with a degree in Industrial Technology.

During college at UNI, Bill noticed an attractive young woman who frequently was out mowing her lawn when he returned home from classes. He managed to meet her and in 1946 Shirley Ross became Mrs. William Raisch.

There were six children born to Shirley and Bill: daughter, Terry, a UNI graduate in Human Services, now living in Grinnell; Bill (William F.), a Drake graduate, Urbandale attorney, with wife, Marsha, active members of Westkirk; Charles, a school administrator in the Colorado; Kevin has a PhD in micro-biology, now living in Birmingham, Alabama; Mark has a degree in Computer Science, now at Florida Children's Hospital in St. Petersburg; Paul has a Biology degree and works and lives in El Paso, Texas. The family includes eighteen Grandchildren and the recent birth of Emma Brown brings the Great-Grandchildren count to five.

After college, Bill taught Industrial Arts at Jefferson, Iowa. Wanting to do his part to make improvements in school systems, he went back to school at Drake University and obtained a Masters degree in school administration. He was principal at Monroe, superintendent of schools at Walker, Waukee, and Prairie City; Director of Instruction at Charles City; Superintendent for 10 years at Manchester; sold text books for six years and was Superintendent at Van Meter for two years, where he suffered a stroke and retired in 1981.

The next five years were difficult with both Bill and Shirley having health issues. They remained in this area during that time and joined the forming Westkirk congregation just before Shirley's death in 1986. Bill is a Charter member of Westkirk Presbyterian Church and served as the chairman of the building committee responsible for planning and overseeing the construction of the beautiful building where we now worship. It was interesting to learn about the construction experience Bill brought to this task due to directing reconstruction of schools which had been destroyed by tornados in two communities where he had served.

When asked if he had any hobbies, Bill said he didn't have time for hobbies. . "Children were my hobby." I'm sure he was referring to his own as well as those under his supervision in the schools he served. Son Bill tells us his father didn't miss his children's sports events—even coming to practices.

We thank you, Bill, for your willingness to allow God to use your leadership abilities and your dedication in serving ten years as an Elder here at Westkirk. We thank God for placing a man of your talents and experience in the right place at the right time.
